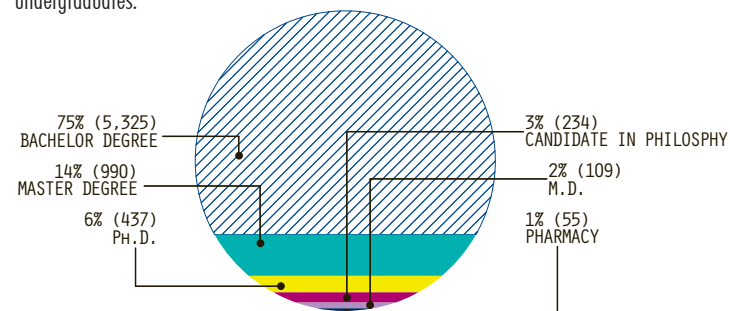

TOTAL UCSD ENROLLMENT

UCSD enrolled almost six thousand graduate and medical students, and over twenty-three thousand undergraduate students.

DEGREES CONFERRED

In 2008/2009, UCSD awarded a total of 7,150 degrees; of these, 75% were awarded to undergraduates.

Over four-fifths of all students who begin their undergraduate studies at UCSD complete their degree requirements at UCSD.

HOUSING

In fall 2009, approximately 38% of all undergraduates lived in on-campus housing. The types of student housing include residence halls, single undergraduate apartments, and married student apartments.

On campus residence halls and single undergraduate apartments accommodate 8,193 students: 3,642 in residence halls and 4,551 in apartments.

Mesa, Coast, One Miramar Street and Single Graduate Apartments comprise 1,358 apartments housing 2,314 students and approximately 714 family members when applicable.

La Jolla Del Sol apartments (faculty, staff, graduate students, and upper-division undergraduates) include 381 condominiums housing 199 faculty, 117 staff, 57 graduate and upper-division students, and 232 family members approximately.

Approximately 93% of the Fall 2009 entering class of freshmen were housed on campus in residence halls or apartments.

STUDENT COSTS

University fees for the 2009-10 academic year total approximately \$9,401 for full-time California resident undergraduate students. Non-resident undergraduate students pay an additional \$22,021 non-resident tuition and \$696 education fee. Graduate student fees are \$11,045 for California residents. Non-resident tuition for graduates is \$14,694 with a \$348 education fee. Please note, some graduate programs have different costs and additional professional fees. All fees are subject to change.

The exact cost of attending the University of California, San Diego will vary according to personal tastes and financial resources of the individual. Generally, the total expense for three quarters or a college year, is estimated at approximately \$25,515 for California undergraduate residents living in University housing or off-campus.

FINANCIAL AID

In 2009-2010, approximately 67% of all undergraduate students are expected to receive some type of financial assistance from a wide variety of programs including Federal, State, UC and outside sources in the form of loans, grants, work-study and scholarships. This includes need and non-need students.

SCHOLARSHIPS

For the 2009-2010 academic year, UCSD estimates administering \$4.4 million in scholarship support for undergraduate students from UC and gift and endowment sources. This includes nearly \$1.4 million in Regents Scholarships.

Notable awards to graduate students in 2009 included 61 National Science Foundation fellowships and 196 U.S. Public Health Service traineeships.

STUDY ABROAD

During the 2008-2009 academic year, 1,177 students were abroad participating in academic and experiential programs at more than 150 institutions in over 51 foreign countries through the University's Education Abroad, Opportunities Abroad, and Global Seminar programs. UCSD students received over \$499,000 in special study abroad scholarships to support their study abroad sojourns.

CAREER SERVICES CENTER

Last year, the Career Services Center posted over 2,670 off-campus part-time listings, over 2,555 internship listings, and over 3,190 on-campus listings (does not take into account students remaining in position from previous year or rehires). Many of the listings in all categories have multiple openings.

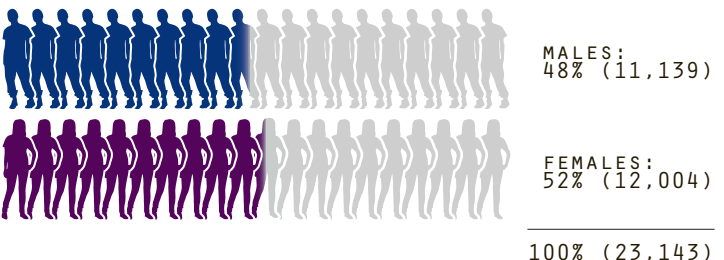

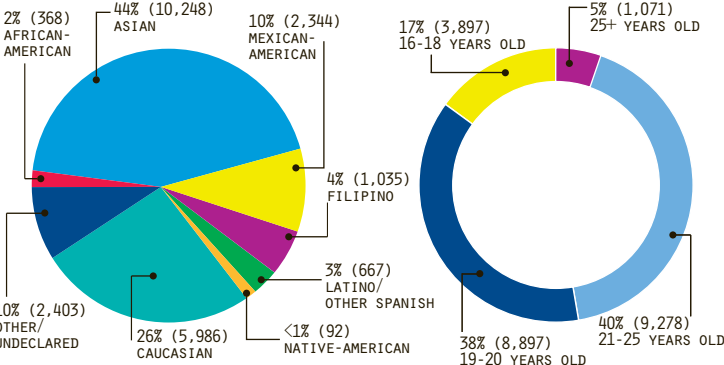

UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT

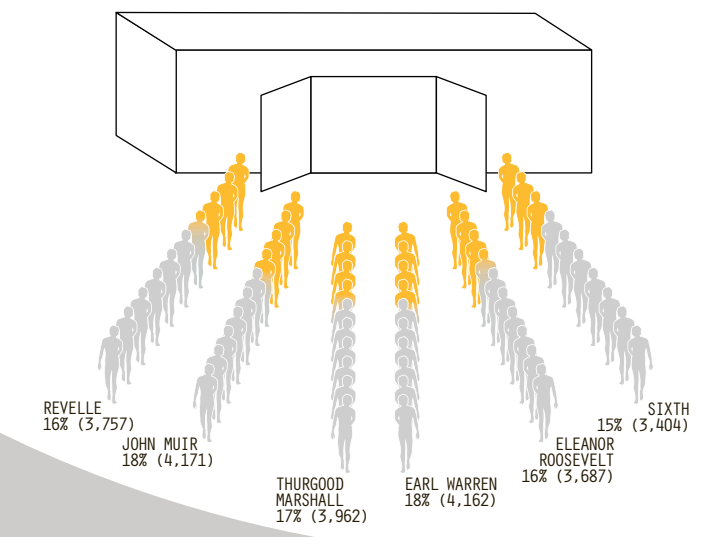
GENDER

The undergraduate student body at UCSD is ethnically diverse; approximately 64% of undergraduates are students of color.

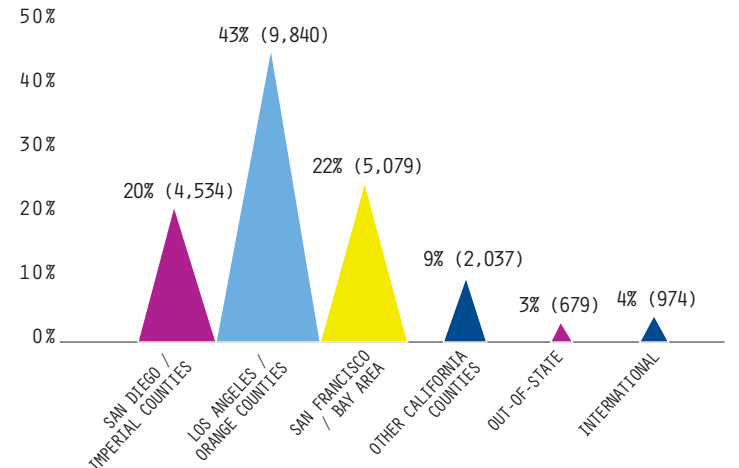


UNDERGRADUATE COLLEGES
Currently John Muir and Earl Warren Colleges enroll the largest number of undergraduates.



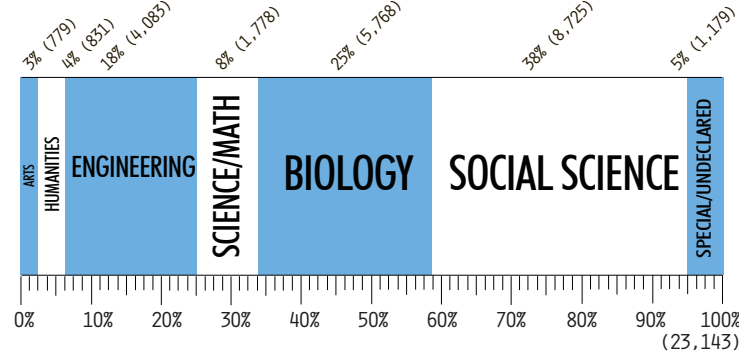
GEOGRAPHIC ORIGIN

93% of all undergraduates are from California. Out-of-state and international students represent approximately 7% of the undergraduate student body.



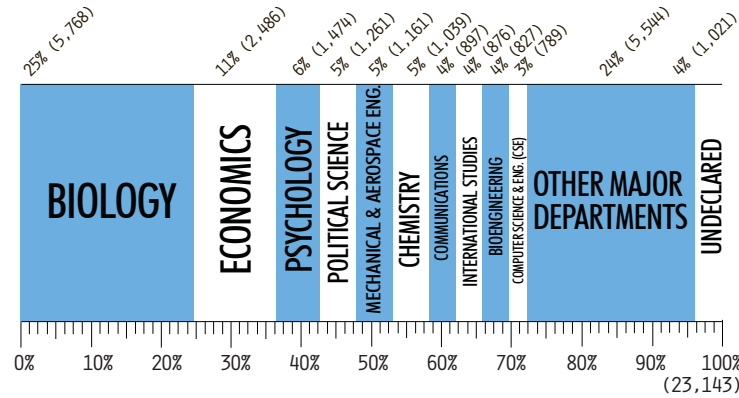
FIELDS OF STUDY

The 10 most frequently declared undergraduate major departments are listed below. 25% of all undergraduate students major in biology.



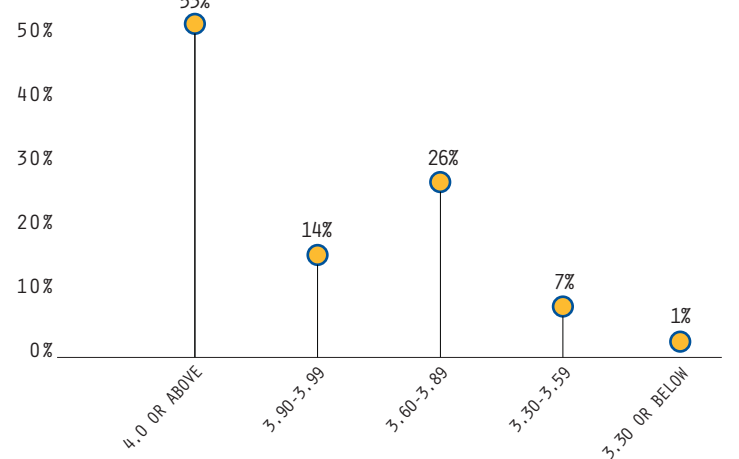
NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT

A total of 5,691 new students enrolled in classes in the Fall 2009 term. At 1,942, this is the largest transfer cohort to date.



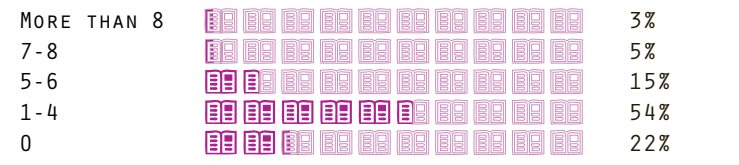
FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN

The average high school GPA for the 2009 freshman cohort was 3.96; over one-half had GPA of 4.0 or higher. GPAs may exceed 4.0 due to credit for honors courses.



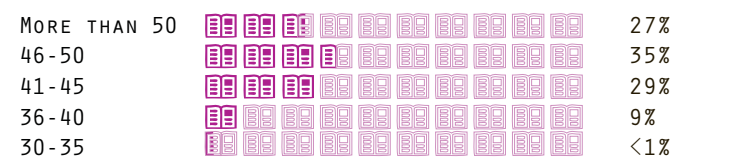
HONORS COURSES

The average number of honors courses taken in the 10th and 11th grades for the 2009 freshman cohort was 4.



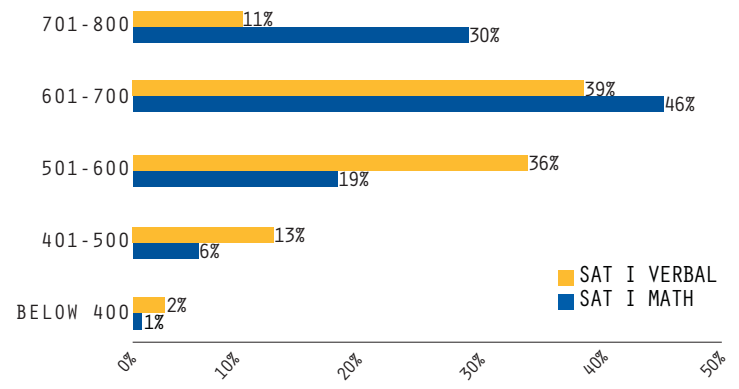
COLLEGE PREPARATORY (A-G) COURSES

For the 2009 freshman cohort, the average number of A-G semester courses completed in high school was 48. The minimum A-G course requirement is 30 semester courses - 14 of which must be taken during the last two years of high school.



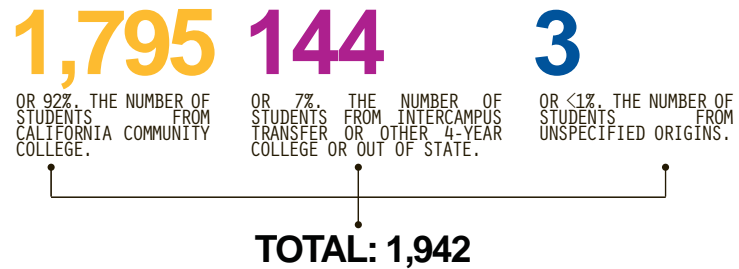
SAT SCORES

The average SAT I composite score for the 2009 freshman cohort was 1257. The average SAT I Verbal and Math scores were 601 and 655, respectively.



TRANSFER STUDENTS

The vast majority of transfer students attend California Community Colleges prior to enrolling at UCSD.



TRANSFER GRADE POINT AVERAGE

The average transfer GPA for the 2009 transfer cohort was 3.41. 91% of all transfer matriculants had GPAs of 3.0 or higher.
