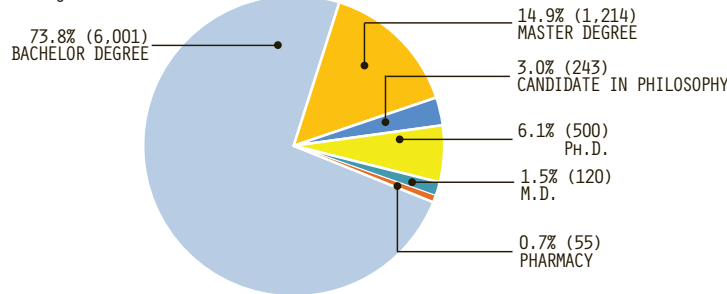

TOTAL UCSD ENROLLMENT

UCSD enrolled 6,692 graduate and medical students, and 24,810 undergraduate students.

DEGREES CONFERRED

In 2013/2014, UCSD awarded a total of 8,133 degrees; of these, 73.8% were awarded to undergraduates.

HOUSING

In Fall 2014, as of 10-01-14, 10,799 or approximately 44% of all undergraduates live in on-campus housing based on third week enrollment numbers. The types of student housing include residence halls, single undergraduate apartments, and married student apartments.

On campus residence halls and single undergraduate apartments accommodate 10,799 students: 4,135 in residence halls and 6,664 in apartments.

Mesa, Coast, One Miramar Street, Single Graduate Apartments at Warren and the Rita Atkinson Residences comprise 1,810 apartments housing 2,259 students and approximately 973 family members when applicable.

La Jolla Del Sol apartments (faculty and staff housing) include 381 condominiums housing 239 faculty, 134 staff and 355 family members with 5 graduate/medical students and 3 family members.

Approximately 95% of the Fall 2014 entering class of freshmen were housed on campus in residence halls or apartments.

STUDENT COSTS

At UC San Diego, annual 2014-15 undergraduate student tuition and fees are currently \$13,456 for California residents, plus an additional \$1,632 health insurance fee. Students that are currently covered by a comparable health care insurance plan and have a primary care provider within 40 miles of UCSD may qualify for the health fee waiver. Non-California resident undergraduate students currently pay an additional annual amount of \$22,878 non-resident supplemental tuition. All tuition and fees are subject to change.

Annual graduate student tuition and fees are \$16,130 for California residents. Graduate student health care insurance in the amount of \$3,201 is included in the graduate resident fees. Students that are currently covered by a comparable health care insurance plan and have a primary care provider within 40 miles of UCSD may qualify for the health fee waiver. Supplemental tuition and fees for non-California residents for graduate students are \$15,102. Please note, some graduate programs have different costs and additional professional fees. All tuition and fees are subject to change.

UC San Diego's estimated total basic budget for undergraduates for the 2014-2015 for three quarters (an academic year) is estimated at approximately \$31,245 for California undergraduate residents living in University housing (this includes resident tuition and fees, health insurance fee, books and supplies, room and board, transportation and personal expenses).

FINANCIAL AID

In 2014-2015, approximately 66% of all undergraduate students are expected to receive some type of financial assistance from a wide variety of programs including Federal, State, UC and outside sources in the form of loans, grants, work-study and scholarships. This includes need and non-need students.

SCHOLARSHIPS

For the 2014-2015 academic year, UCSD estimates administering approximately \$6 million in scholarship support for undergraduate students from UC and gift and endowment sources. This includes nearly \$1.3 million in Regents Scholarships.

Notable awards to graduate students in 2014 included 117 National Science Foundation fellowships and 182 U.S. Public Health Service* traineeships.

STUDY ABROAD

During the 2013-2014 academic year, over 900 students were abroad participating in academic and experiential programs in over 55 foreign countries through the University's Global Seminars, Education Abroad, Opportunities Abroad and Departmentally hosted programs. UCSD students received over \$650,000 in special study abroad scholarships to support their study abroad experiences.

CAREER SERVICES CENTER

Last year (2013/2014), the Career Services Center posted 2,202 off-campus part-time listings, 3,198 internship listings, and 2,328 on-campus listings (does not take into account students remaining in position from previous year or rehires). Many of the listings in all categories have multiple openings.

At 52.5%, men represent the majority of undergraduate students on the UC San Diego campus.



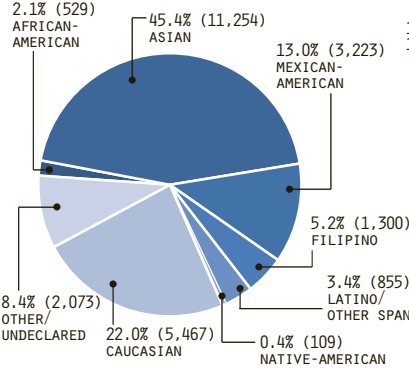

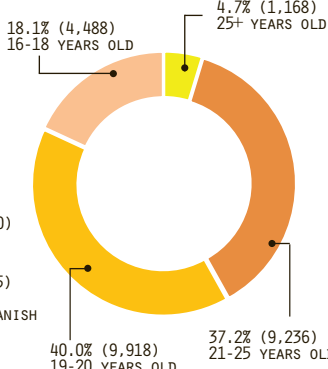
ETHNICITY

The undergraduate student body at UCSD is ethnically diverse; approximately 70% of undergraduates are students of color.



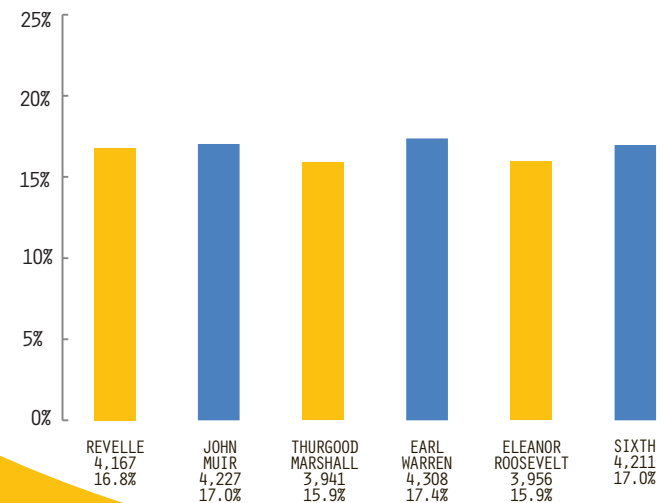
AGE

The average age of undergraduates is 21 years; the vast majority are under the age of 25.



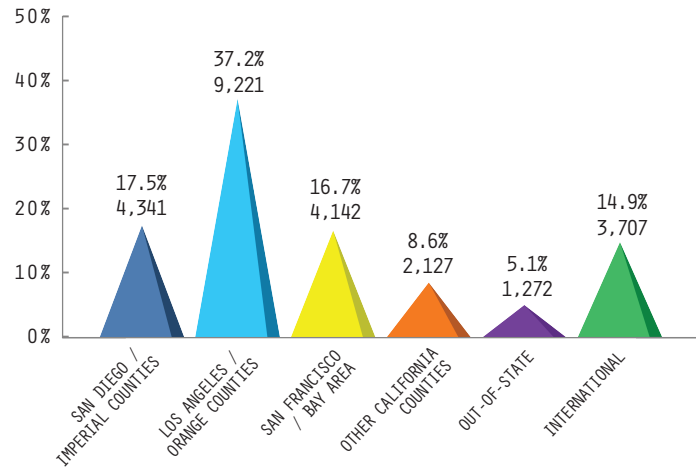
UNDERGRADUATE COLLEGES

Currently Earl Warren and John Muir Colleges enroll the largest number of undergraduates.



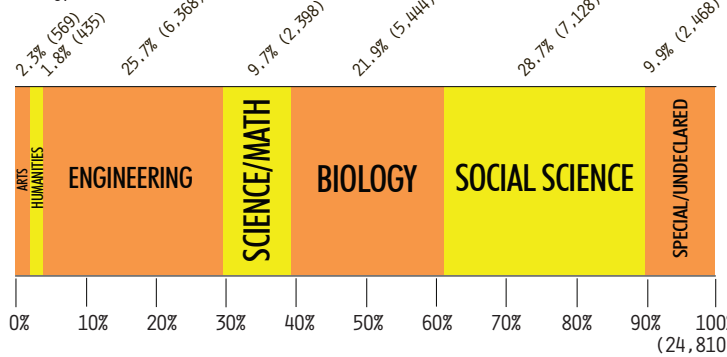
GEOGRAPHIC ORIGIN

80% of all undergraduates are from California. Out-of-state and international students represent approximately 20% of the undergraduate student body.



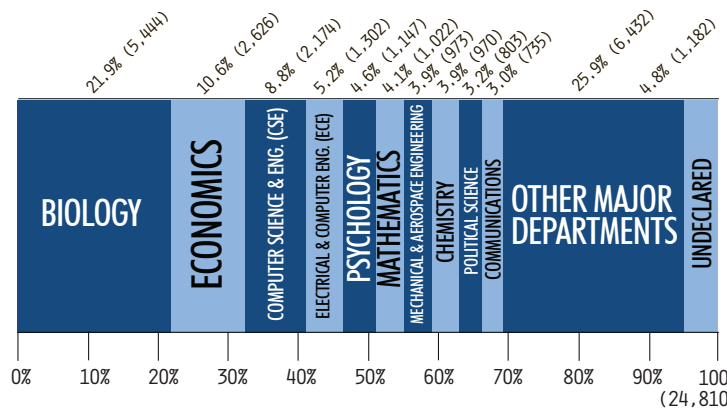
FIELDS OF STUDY

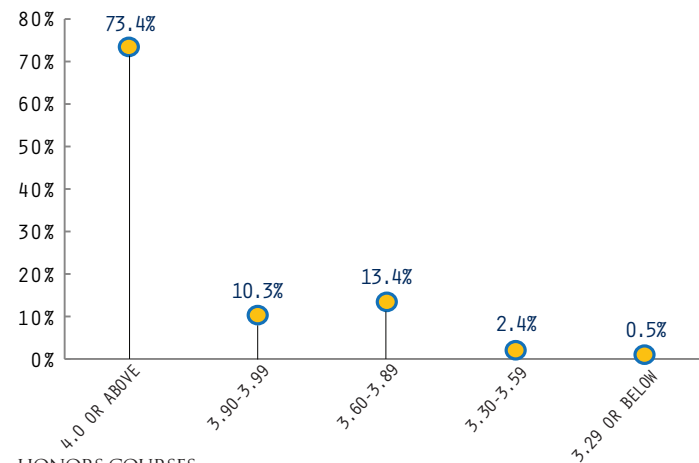

FIRST-TIME FRESHMENS

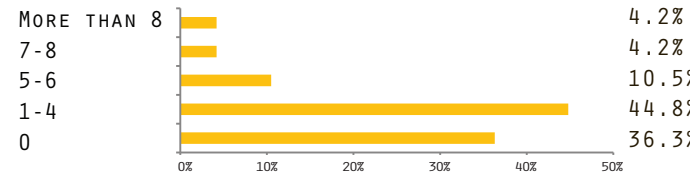
HIGH SCHOOL GRADE POINT AVERAGE

The average high school GPA for the 2014 freshman cohort was 4.08; 73.4% had GPA of 4.0 or higher. GPAs may exceed 4.0 due to credit for honors courses.



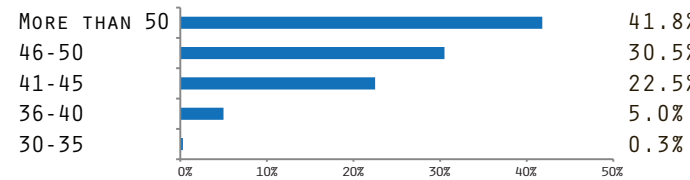
HONORS COURSES

The average number of honors courses taken in the 10th and 11th grades for the 2014 freshman cohort was 4.5.



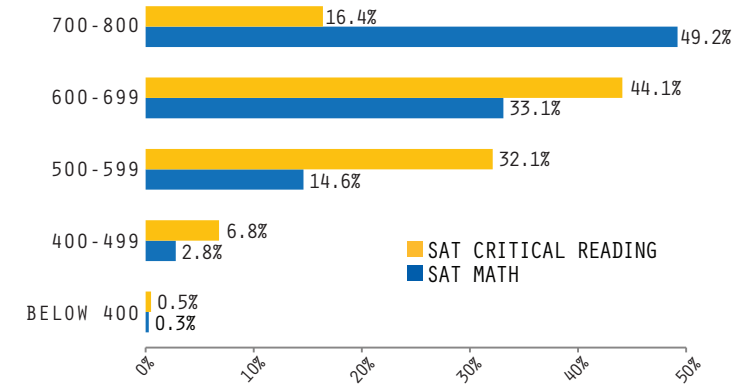
COLLEGE PREPARATORY (A-G) COURSES

For the 2014 freshman cohort, the average number of A-G semester courses completed in high school was 53. The minimum A-G course requirement is 30 semester courses - 14 of which must be taken during the last two years of high school.



SAT REASONING TEST SCORES

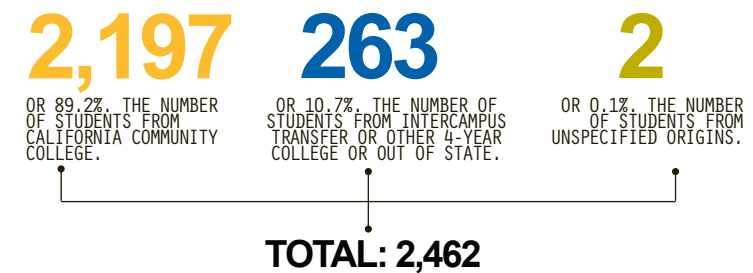

TRANSFER GRADE POINT AVERAGE

The average transfer GPA for the 2014 transfer cohort was 3.61. 89.3% of all transfer matriculants had GPAs of 3.30 or higher.
