




UCSD Then and Now: Demographic Profile











"Very Important" Factors Influencing Decision to Attend UCSD (2002 Cohort)



Anticipated Levels of Satisfaction With UCSD










FINANCIAL CONCERNS

Comparing Financial Concerns: 1991 versus 2002









Grades and Academic Behavior 1984 - 2002






Self-Reported "Above Average" or "Highest 10%"




Computer Use in the Last Year




