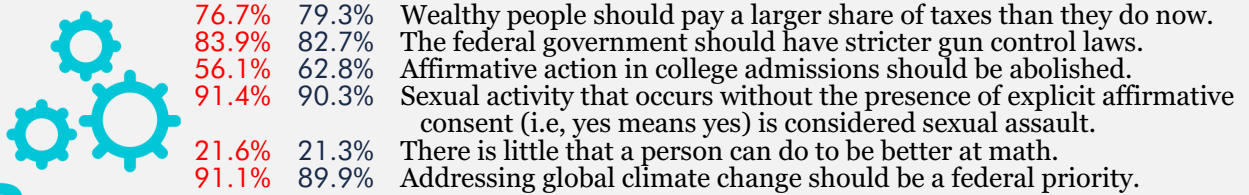

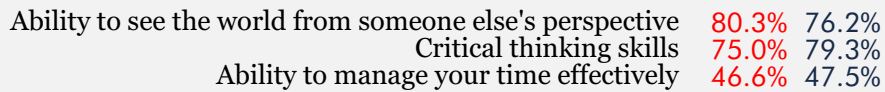

Percentage indicating "agree strongly" or "agree somewhat" that...

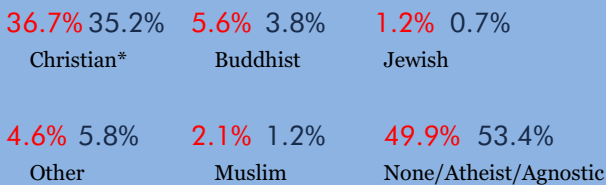


OPINIONS ON SELF

Percentage indicating "A Major Strength" or "Somewhat Strong"...

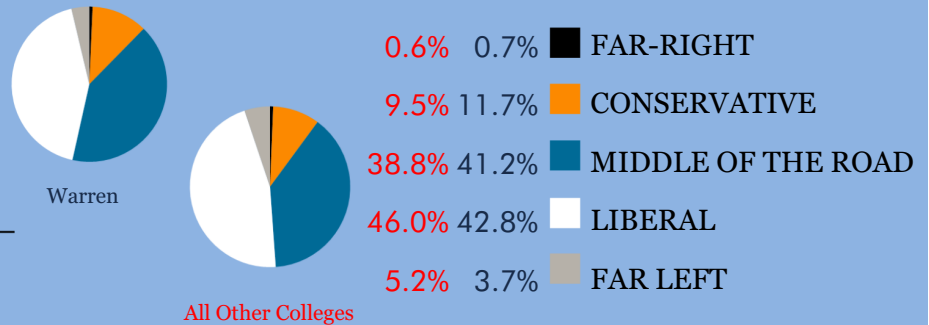


RELIGIOUS AFFILIATIONS

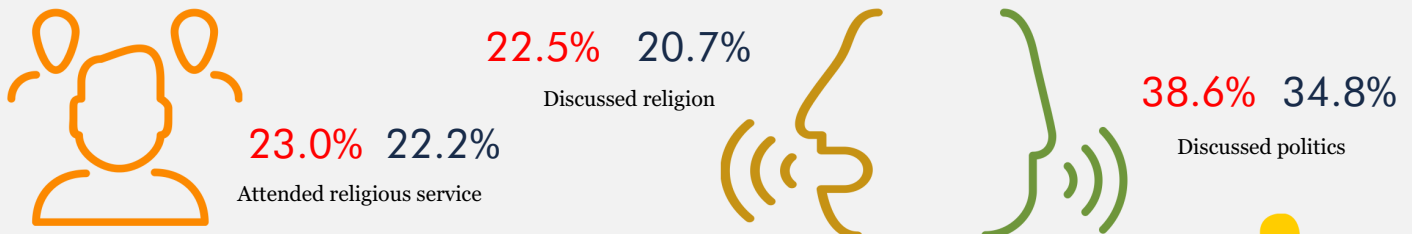

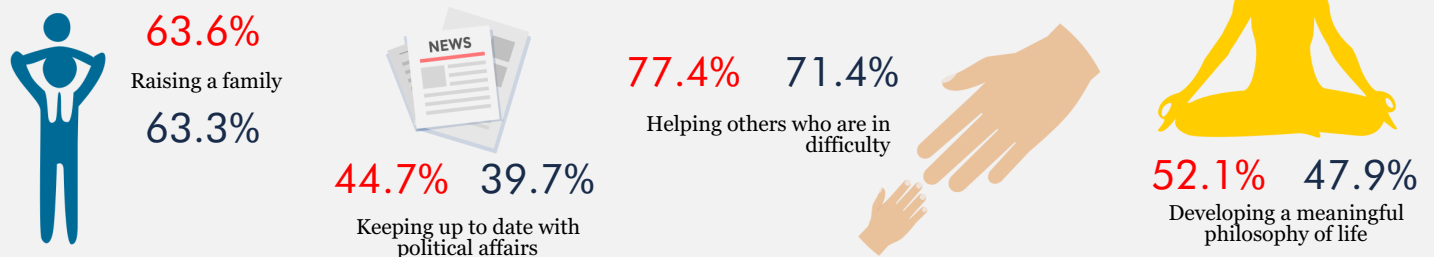
POLITICAL AFFILIATIONS

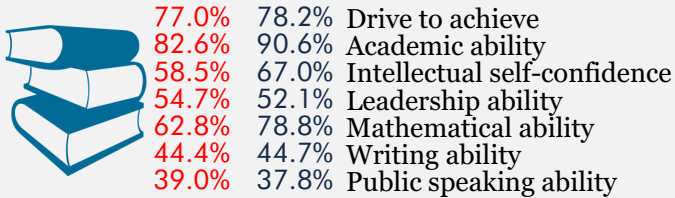

Percentage rating self "above average" or "highest 10%" (compared with average person their age)



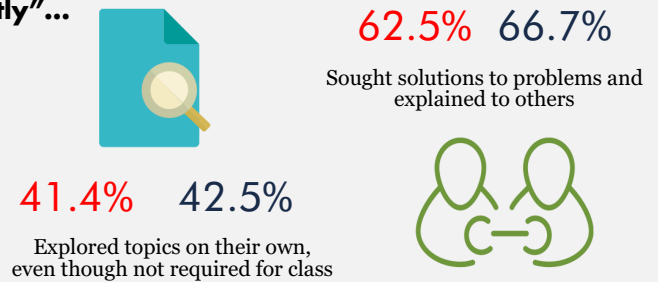
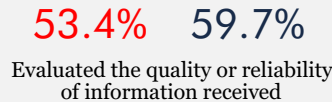
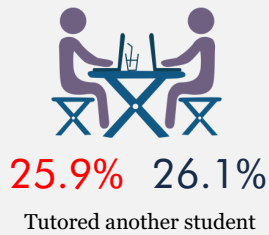
THE CIRP FRESHMAN SURVEY

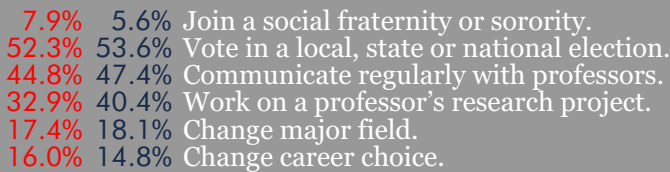

Percentage reporting that in the past year they "frequently"...

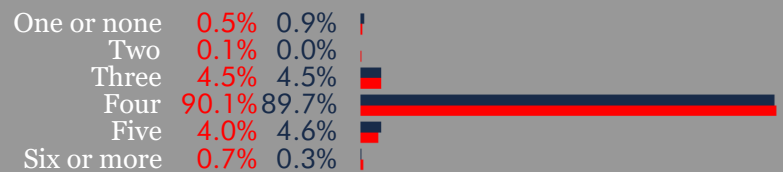


EXPECTATIONS FOR COLLEGE EXPERIENCES

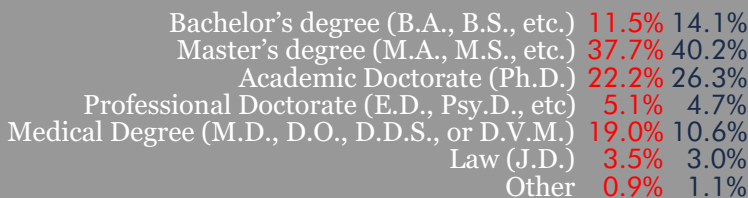
Percentage indicating a "very good chance" that they will...



Number of years expected to take to graduate college

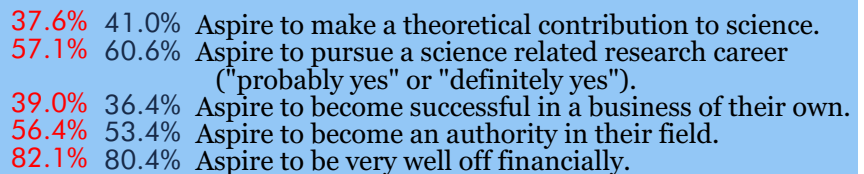


HIGHEST DEGREE PLANNED
