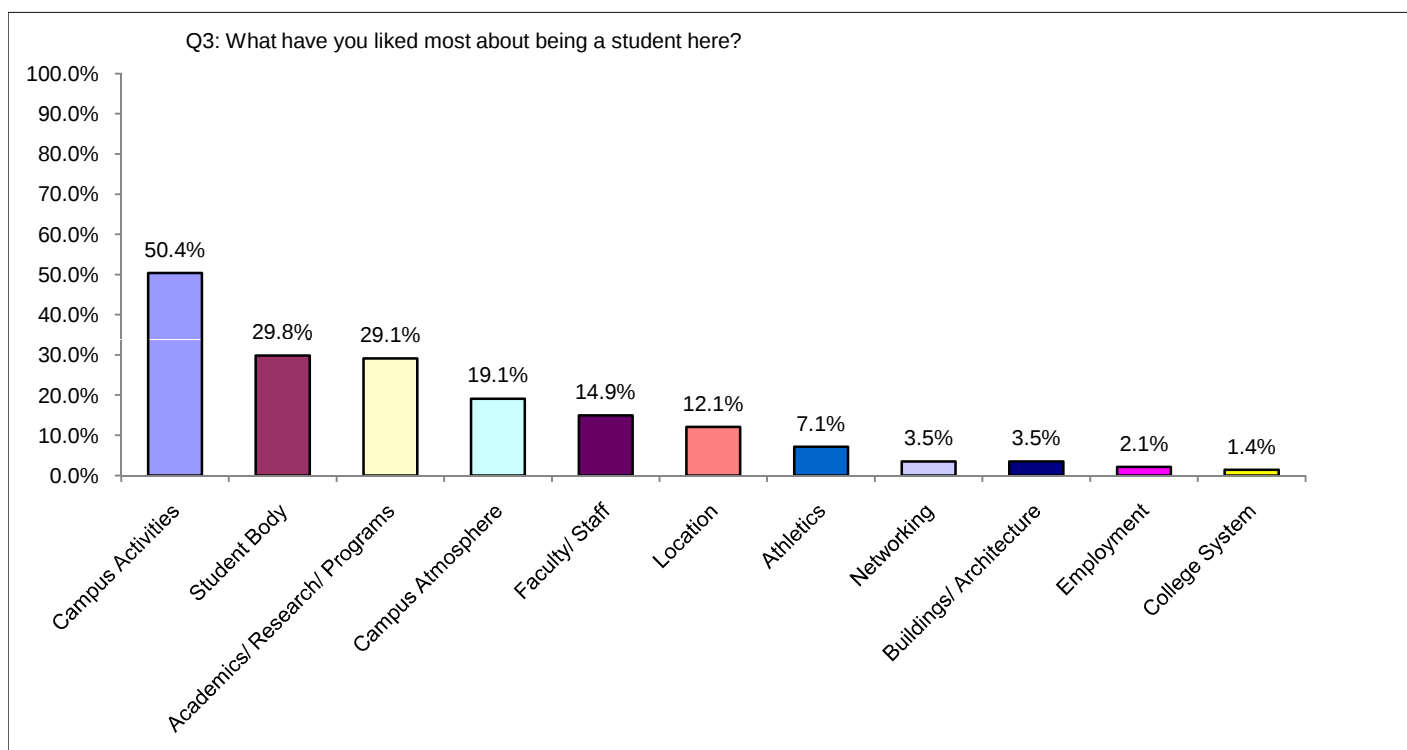

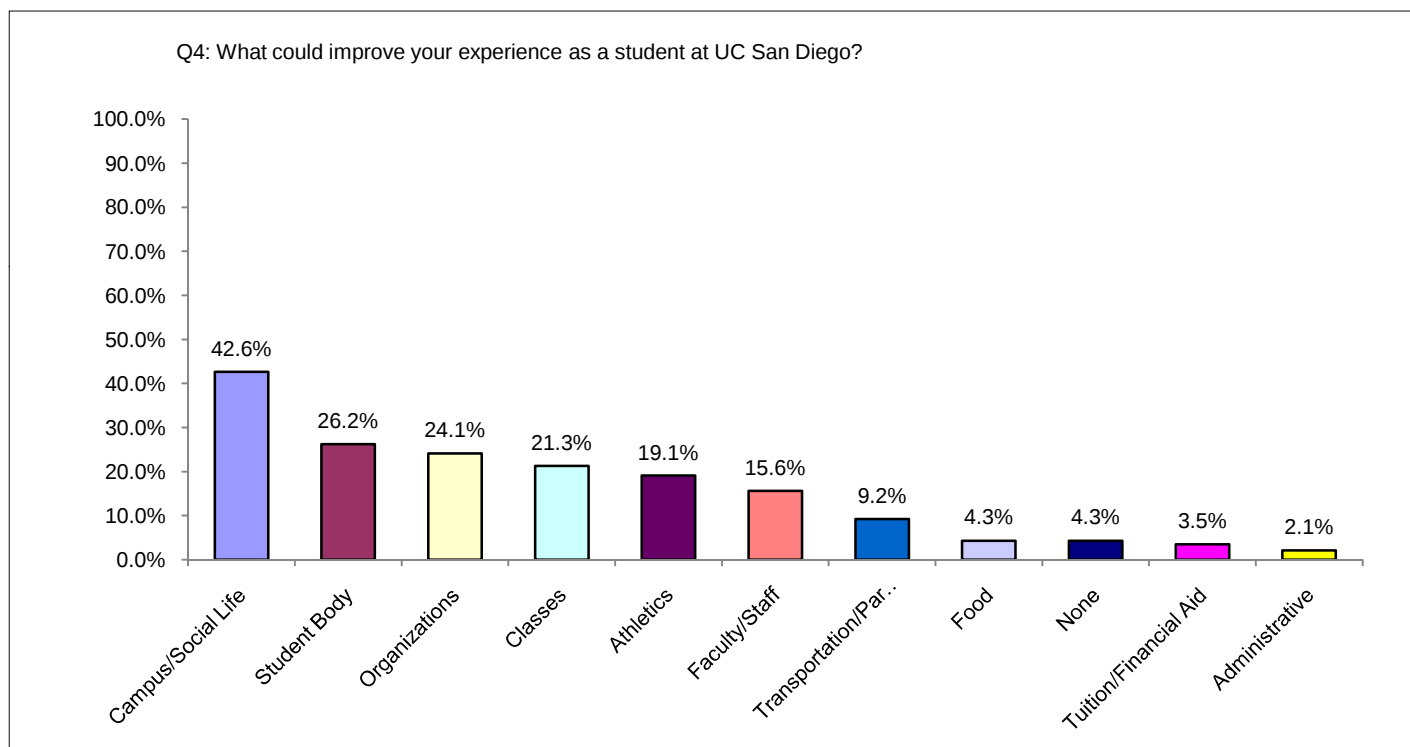

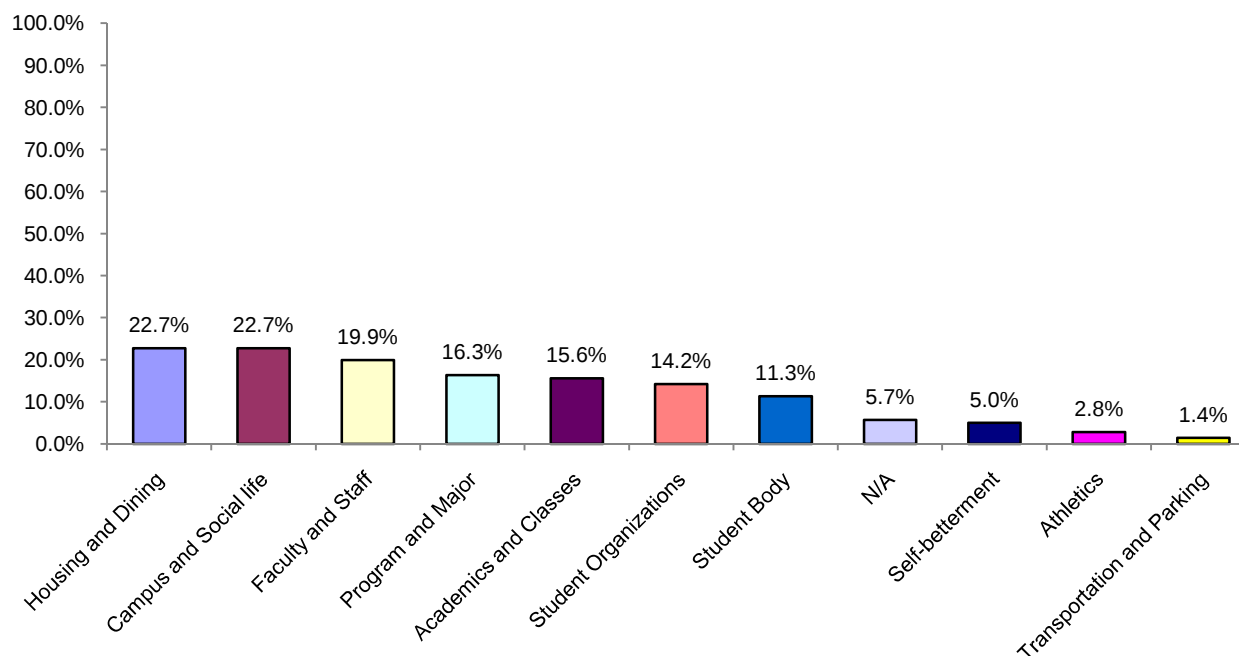

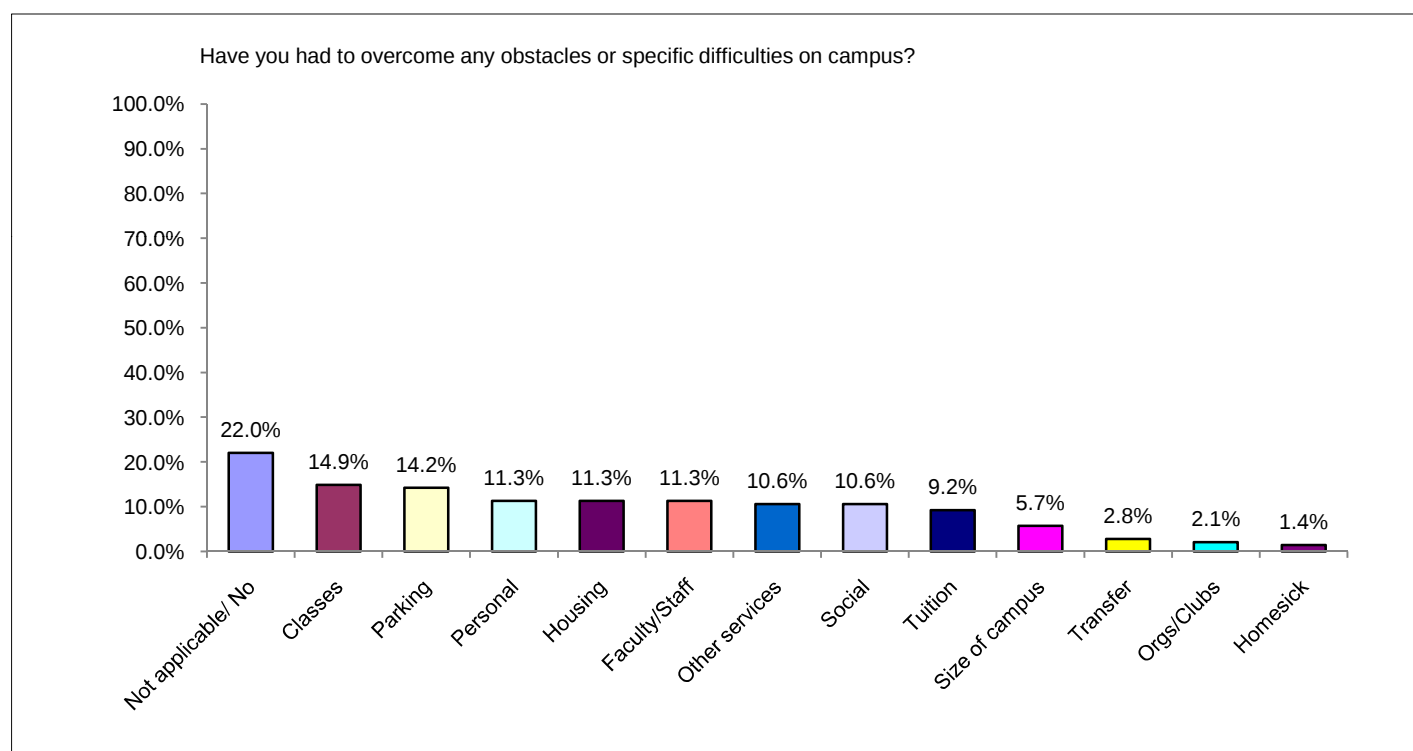

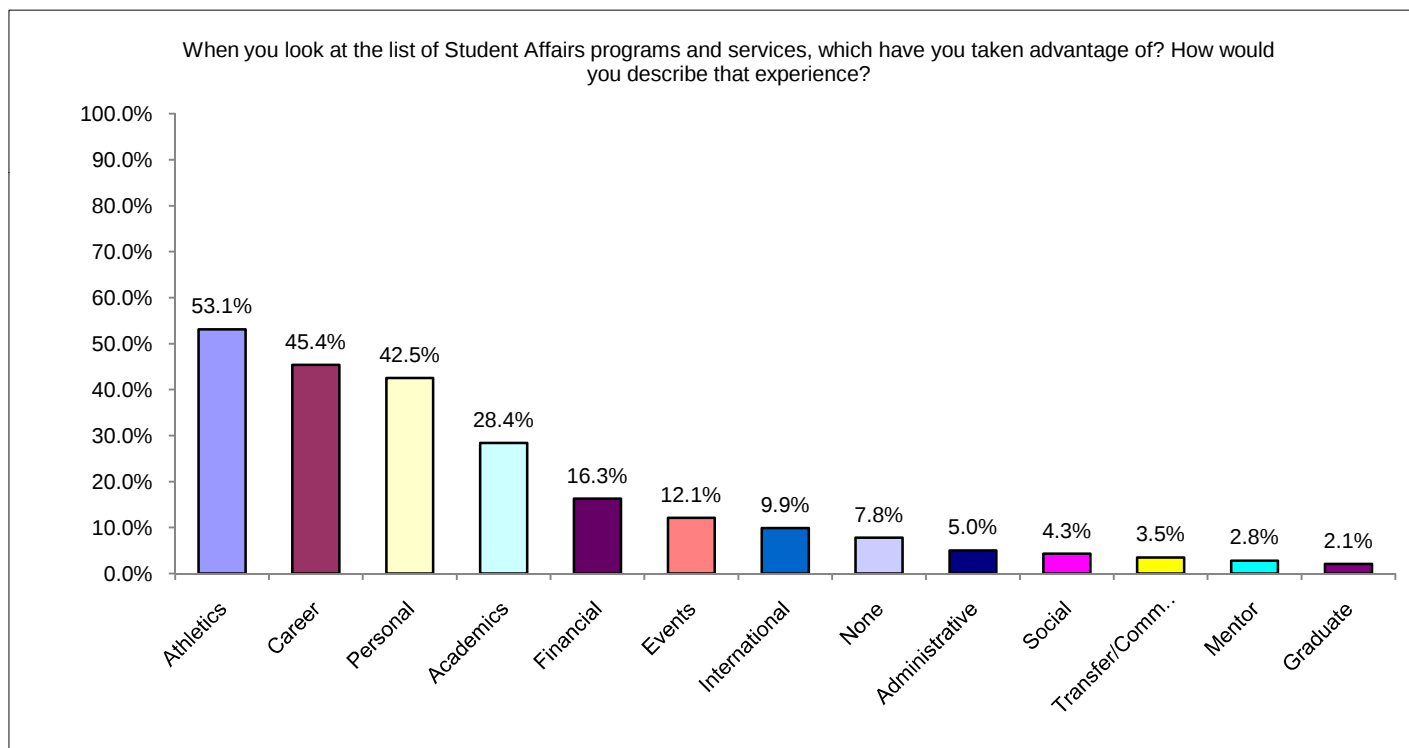

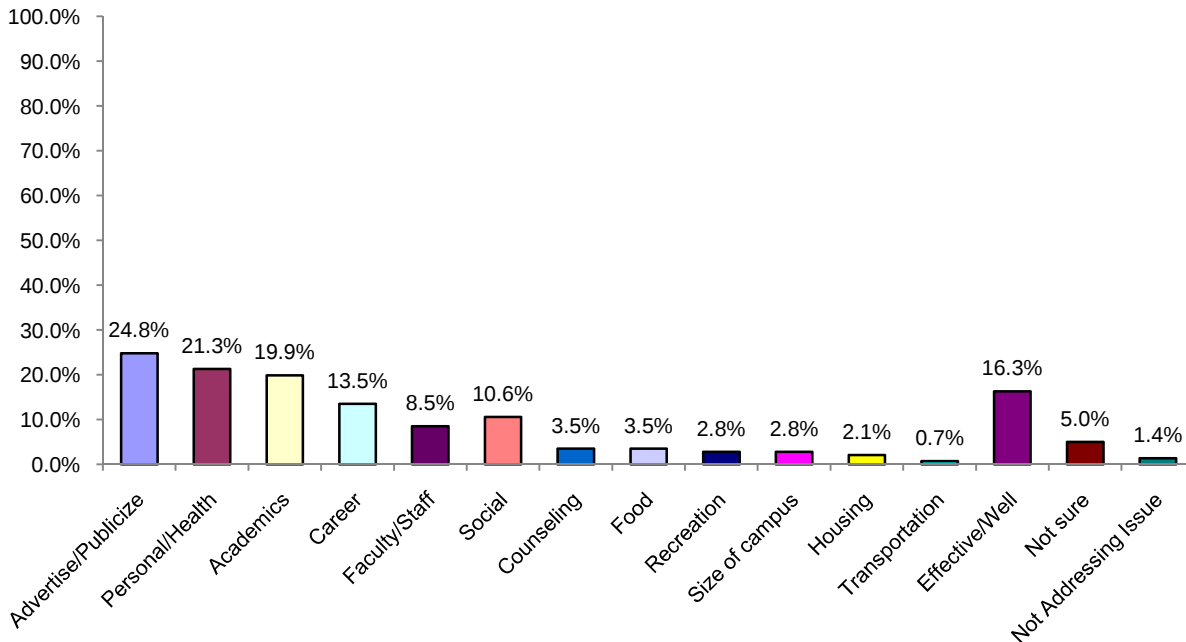

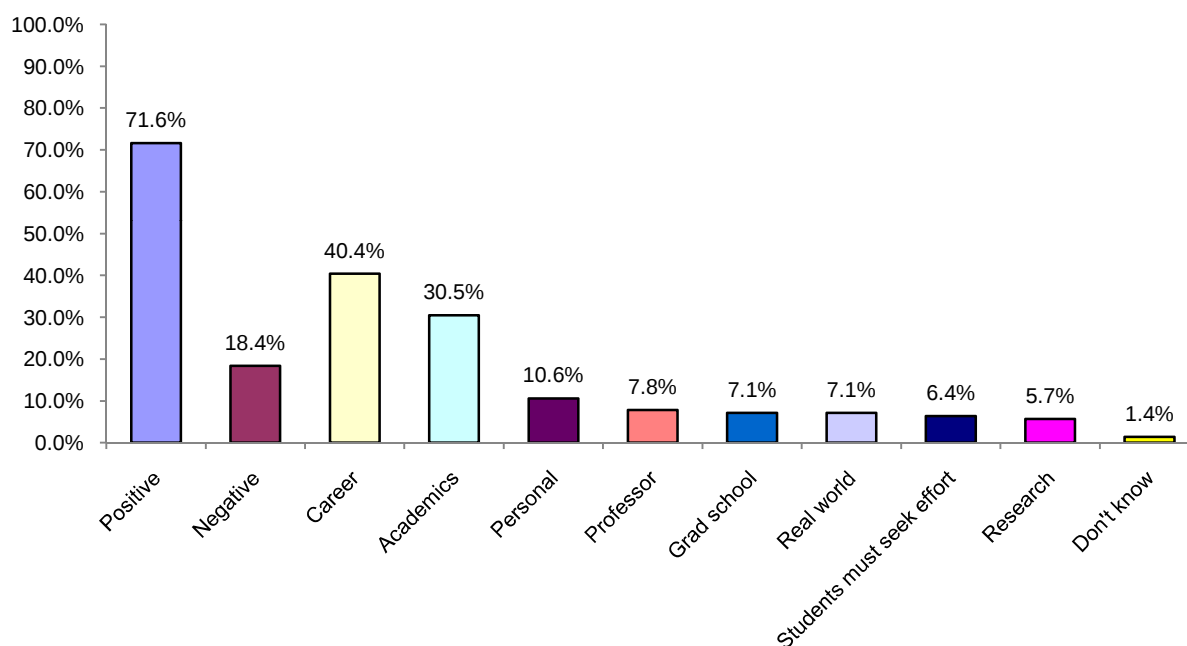
Q8: How effectively is the campus addressing your well-being so that you can be successful?
