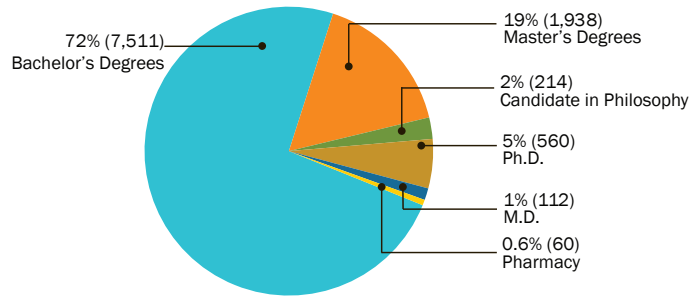


DEGREES CONFERRED

In 2018/2019, UC San Diego awarded a total of 10,395 degrees; of these, 72% were awarded to undergraduates.



GRADUATION RATES - UNDERGRADUATES

Over four-fifths of all students who begin their undergraduate studies at UC San Diego complete their degree requirements at UC San Diego.

HOUSING

In Fall 2019, 11,790 undergraduates live in on-campus housing based on third week enrollment numbers. The types of student housing include residence halls and single undergraduate apartments.

On campus residence halls and single undergraduate apartments accommodated 11,645 students: 4,213 in residence halls and 7,432 in apartments.

Mesa, Mesa Nueva, Coast, One Miramar Street, and the Rita and Atkinson Residences comprise 2,229 apartments, housing 2,946 students approximately 869 family members when applicable.

La Jolla Del Sol apartments (faculty and staff housing) include 380 units housing 258 faculty, 84 staff and 469 family members with 31 graduate/medical students and 54 family members.

Approximately 90% of the Fall 2018 entering class of first-time first-year students were housed on campus in residence halls or apartments.

STUDENT COSTS

At UC San Diego, annual 2019-2020 undergraduate student tuition and fees are currently \$14,451 for California residents, plus an additional \$2,040 health insurance fee. Students that are currently covered by a comparable health care insurance plan and have a primary care provider within 40 miles of UC San Diego may qualify for the health fee waiver. Non-California resident undergraduate students currently pay an additional annual amount of \$29,754 non-resident supplemental tuition. All tuition and fees are subject to change.

Annual graduate student tuition and fees are \$17,355 for California residents. Graduate student health care insurance in the amount of \$3,900 is included in the graduate resident fees. Students that are currently covered by a comparable health care insurance plan and have a primary care provider within 40 miles of UC San Diego may qualify for the health fee waiver. Supplemental tuition and fees for non-California residents for graduate students are \$15,102. Please note, some graduate programs have different costs and additional professional fees. All tuition and fees are subject to change.

UC San Diego's estimated total basic budget for undergraduates for the 2019-2020 for three quarters (an academic year) is estimated at approximately \$31,887 for California undergraduate residents living in University housing (this includes resident tuition and fees, books and supplies, room and board, transportation and personal expenses).

FINANCIAL AID

In 2019-2020, approximately 70% of all undergraduate students are expected to receive some type of financial assistance from a wide variety of programs including Federal, State, UC, and outside sources in the form of loans, grants, work-study and scholarships. This includes need and non-need students.

SCHOLARSHIPS

For the 2019-2020 academic year, UC San Diego estimates administering approximately \$10.77 million in scholarship support for undergraduate students from UC and gift and endowment sources. This includes \$1.5 million in Regents Scholarships, and over \$2 million in athletic scholarships.

Notable awards to graduate students in 2019 included 105 National Science Foundation fellowships and 225 U.S. Public Health Service traineeships*.

STUDY ABROAD

During the 2018-2019 academic year, 1349 students were abroad participating in academic and experiential programs in over 70 foreign countries through the University's Global Seminars, University of California Education Abroad Program, Opportunities Abroad and departmentally hosted programs. UC San Diego students received over \$970,000 in scholarships and aid to support their study abroad experiences.

CAREER CENTER

The Career Center team of 20+ works to directly help all undergraduate and graduate students prepare for student employment, internships, full-time roles, graduate school, and starting entrepreneurial ventures. In 2018-2019, the Career Center partnered with 2,000+ employers to connect with students and post over 8,000+ student opportunities.

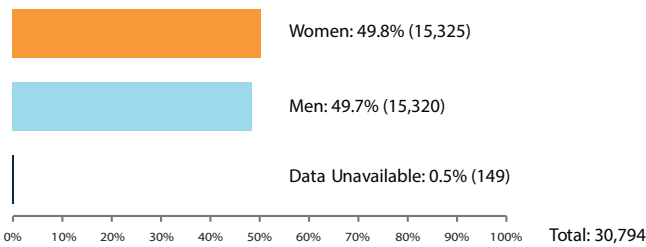

GENDER¹

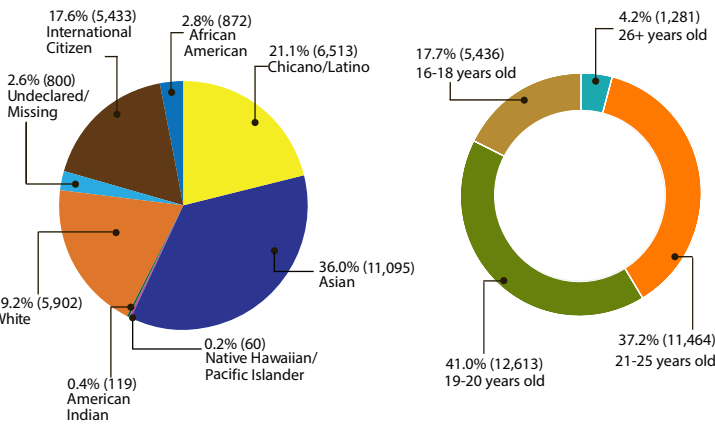
Among undergraduates, the distribution of men and women is approximately equal at 49.8%

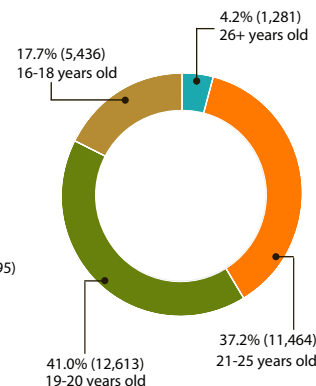
ETHNICITY

The undergraduate student body at UC San Diego is ethnically diverse.



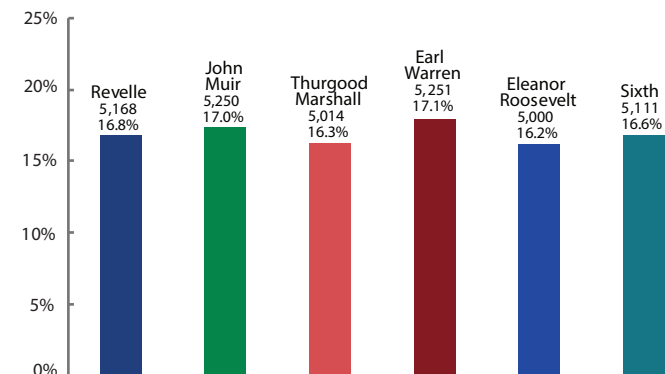
AGE

The average age of undergraduates is 21 years; the vast majority are under the age of 25.



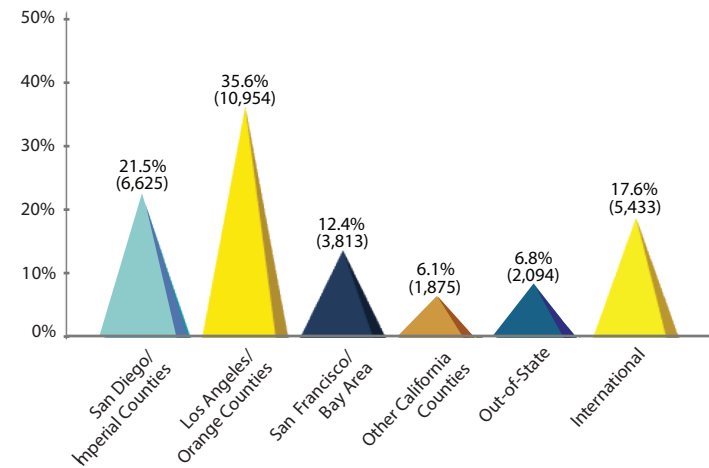
UNDERGRADUATE COLLEGES

Currently Warren and Muir Colleges enroll the largest number of undergraduates.



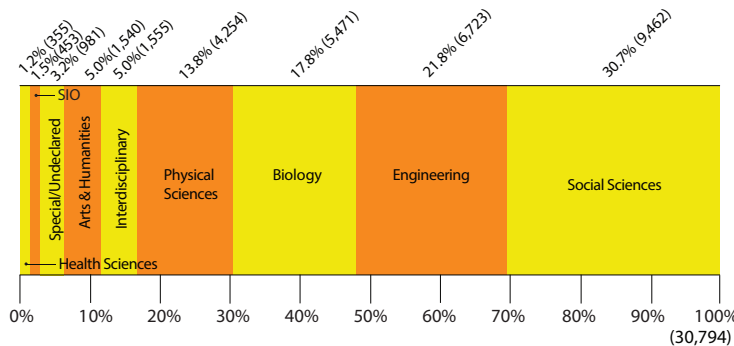
GEOGRAPHIC ORIGIN

Just over three-fourths of all undergraduates are from California. Out-of-state and international students represent approximately one quarter of the undergraduate student body.



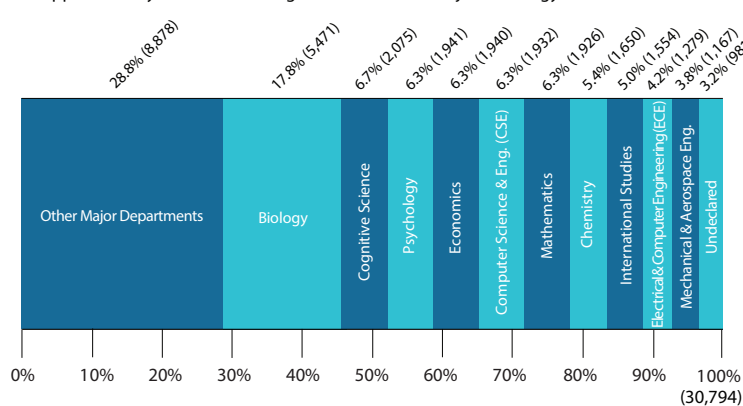
FIELDS OF STUDY

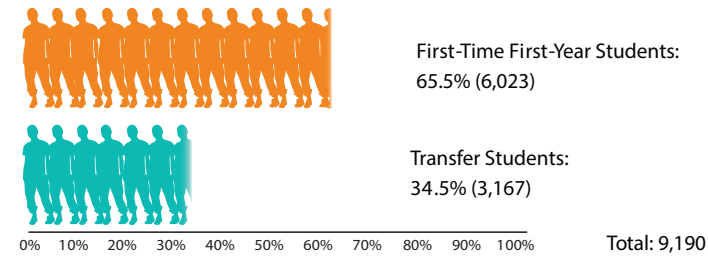
MAJOR DEPARTMENTS

NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT

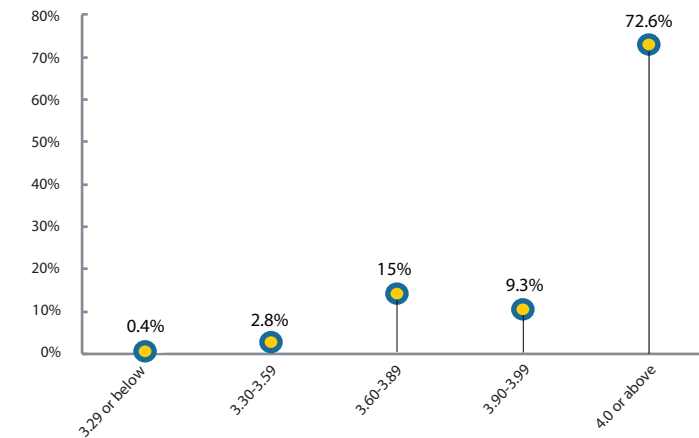
A total of 9,190 new students enrolled in classes in the Fall 2019 term.



FIRST-TIME FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

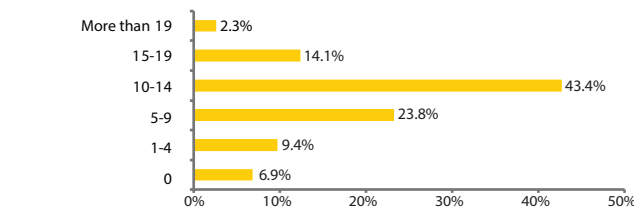
HIGH SCHOOL GRADE POINT AVERAGE

The average high school GPA for the 2019 first-time first-year student cohort was 4.08; almost three-fourths had a GPA of 4.0 or higher. GPAs may exceed 4.0 due to credit for honors courses.



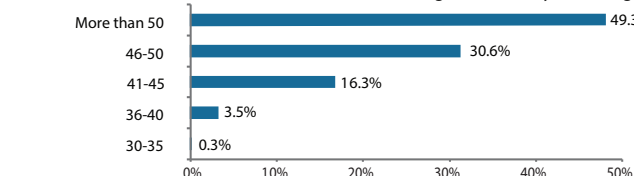
HONORS COURSES

The average number of honors courses taken in the 10th and 11th grades for the 2019 first-time first-year student cohort was 10.



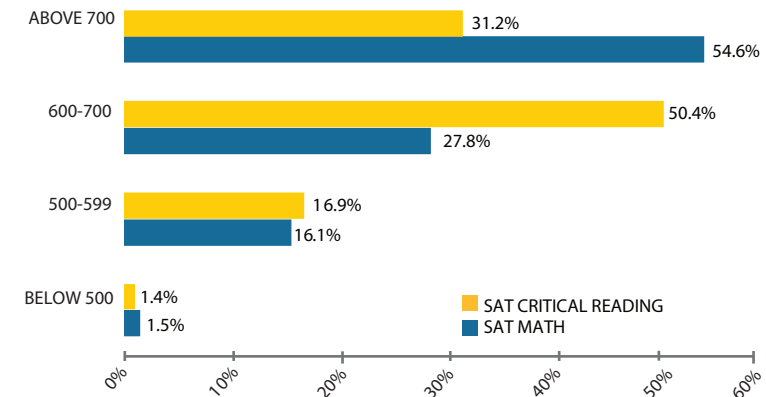
COLLEGE PREPARATORY (A-G) COURSES

For the 2019 first-time first-year student cohort, the average number of A-G semester courses completed in high school was 54. The minimum A-G course requirement is 30 semester courses - 14 of which must be taken during the last two years of high school.



SAT REASONING TEST SCORES

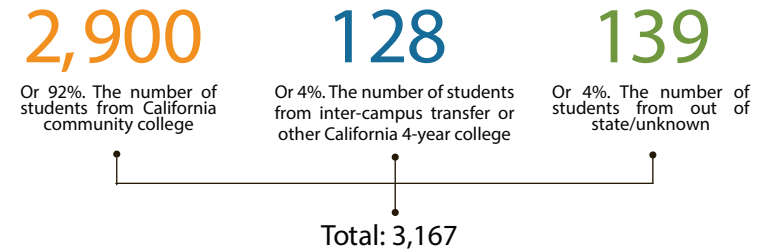
The average SAT Reasoning Test composite score for the 2019 first-time first-year student cohort was 1351. The average SAT Critical Reading and Math scores were 657 and 694, respectively.



TRANSFER STUDENTS

TRANSFER INSTITUTIONS

The vast majority of transfer students attend California Community Colleges prior to enrolling at UC San Diego.



TRANSFER GRADE POINT AVERAGE

The average transfer GPA for the 2019 transfer cohort was 3.52. 80% of all transfer matriculants had GPAs of 3.30 or higher.
