# How to Use the Expected Graduation Rate Calculator

The Expected Graduation Rate Calculator has been pre-populated with results from your CIRP Freshman Survey administration. The darkest bar (in blue) represents the percentage of students expected to graduate in four, five, or six years, based upon the entering characteristics of your students.


The calculator is generated based on first-time, full-time respondents to the CIRP Freshman Survey.

In the "modify" column, you can forecast changes to your degree completion rate by altering the characteristics of the incoming class.
