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A Note about CIRP Constructs


We use the CIRP Constructs throughout this PowerPoint to help summarize important information about your students from the TFS.






College Choice

Many factors impact incoming students' college choice, including the benefits they see in attending college and considerations about which particular college to attend.




College Applications




In deciding to *go to college*, how important to you was each of the following reasons?




How important was each reason in your decision to attend this college?





Do you have any concern about your ability to finance your college education?








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Habits of Mind



Pluralistic Orientation

Pluralistic Orientation measures skills and dispositions appropriate for living and working in a diverse society.



Construct Items

- Ability to discuss and negotiate controversial issues
- Ability to work cooperatively with diverse people



Academic Self-Concept

Self-awareness and confidence in academic environments help students learn by encouraging their intellectual inquiry. *Academic Self-Concept* is a unified measure of students' beliefs about their abilities and confidence in academic environments.

- Self-rated mathematical ability
- Self-rated self-confidence (intellectual)
- Self-rated drive to achieve

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

Civic Engagement

Engaged citizens are a critical element in the functioning of our democratic society. *Civic Engagement* measures the extent to which students are motivated and involved in civic, electoral, and political activities.



Construct Items

- Demonstrated for a cause (e.g., boycott, rally, protest)
- Performed volunteer work
- Helped raise money for a cause or campaign
- Publicly communicated my opinion about a cause (e.g., blog, email, petition)
- Influencing social values
- Keeping up to date with political affairs



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

On how many AP exams did you score a 3 or higher?



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






How many years do you expect it will take you to graduate from this college?

What is the highest academic degree that you intend to attain?















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

College Degree Consideration


To what extent did you consider whether a college degree is even worthwhile given the pandemic and current economy?

What factors influenced your decision to enroll in a different college than expected due to the COVID-19 pandemic?


